Pastor's View

As a called and ordained minister of the church of Christ, and by his authority, I therefore declare to you the entire forgiveness of all your sins. (from Confession and Forgiveness, ELW)

These words are spoken at the beginning of worship. It follows a time of silence when we are invited to confess our sins to God. I wonder if those listening to these words understand the significance of what is being said. It is not the pastor forgiving your sins, it is Jesus Christ. We are forgiven because of God's love and grace. We have laid before God all that we have done to sin against God and against others. God has heard us and God has taken the sin from us. God is giving us a fresh start.

What do we do with this fresh start each week? We go out and sin again. Luther struggled for years with his sinful self until he found forgiveness in Jesus Christ. He thought God could never forgive him for his sins. He thought he had no choice but to live a life of disgrace. Then he read in the Bible about all God had done for him through Jesus Christ. He finally understood that God is not a vengeful God, but loves us just as we are and was willing to sacrifice his Son for us.

Luther was so excited about what the Bible had to tell him that he made sure the Bible would be available to others in a language they could understand. He spread the Good News of Jesus Christ to everyone. He took God's willingness to forgive his sins as a sign that he should make sure others know that same forgiveness. He did not hoard God's grace and mercy for himself, he offered it to all.

I invite you to boldly stand before God and confess your sins. As you do, know that you are a beloved child of God and remember God loves you. This is not an invitation to sin, but an invitation to try your best to live by God's commandments. When you struggle, admit you have come up short of God's expectations. You are not a failure as Luther once thought of himself. You are a work in progress and God is not done shaping you in God's image.

As we enter the summer months, among all you have to do I hope you will make worship one of your priorities. Please join me on Sunday, either in person or online. It may be the most important hour of your week.

- Youth continue to update the stage area at Faith
- Youth will decide at the May 19 meeting if they will continue Bible Jams through the summer.

Pastor's Report:

- Bible School is going well. Pastor enjoys getting to know the children.
- Pastor continues to visit people.

Worship Committee:

- The preparation of a simplified bulletin format was discussed.
- The same two-page booklet format will be used by both congregations for sanctuary bulletins during June. Member feedback will determine future use of this format.
- Readers will actively use the hymnal for liturgy, prayers, creeds, responses, and hymns.
- The simplified "Today's Readings" insert, which includes all lessons, the Psalm, and the Gospel, will be inserted into each bulletin.
- Summer worship services will be determined by individual councils.

- The service will conclude on May 21.
- All food has been distributed.
- Funds remain in the account for restart of program in fall of 2021.

- Joe Morehead was not present to report on contacting of Uthe for more information on the pastor seeking more information about our parish. Item tabled.
- CDC Guidelines announced that anyone fully vaccinated for the COVID 19 virus may discontinue wearing a mask unless in a location that requires masks. Each congregation will determine their mask requirements. Pastor chooses to continue to wear a mask for the safety of others who may not be vaccinated.

• The Financial Secretary and Treasurer's Reports were presented. A gift was received from the Barbara Anderson Olson - Anderson Family Farm Fund. Old Business:

- Outdoor Property Clean-up Day included installation of mulch and future trimming of trees.
- Indoor Property Clean-up was discussed by Joyce Sands and Bousselot. Cleaning Guidelines and frequency of tasks were reviewed during walk-through of church.
- Witte will organize the cleaning of church pews and pew pads. Volunteers will assist with oiling of pews and steam cleaning of pew pads.
- Shelton will address other tasks related to indoor care.
- Parsonage rental is removed from agenda due to no response from interested party.

 Water damaged altar was removed from Children's Chapel. Future purpose is yet to be determined.

New Business:

- Outdoor Worship will be held at 9:30 a.m. on June 6 and continue through June. Pastor will use the simple worship format used for outdoor worship in 2020. An insert which includes all Readings, Psalm, and Gospel will be distributed. No bulletin will be printed. Altar Ministry will prepare communion as usual. Communion Assistant will assist in distribution. Service will be held indoors if weather is not conducive to outdoor location. Continuation of outdoor worship during July and August will depend on member feedback.
- Anyone who is fully vaccinated for COVID 19 is not required to wear a mask when inside the building. This action was based on recent CDC Guidelines.
- Motion made by Shelton to donate \$100 to the Southeastern Iowa Synod for new ministries in the Southeastern Iowa Synod and to support FreeIndeed, a prison congregation inside the walls of the Anamosa State Penitentiary. Hurt seconded. Motion carried. Witte will deliver the check during Synod Assembly on May 21.
- Motion made by Schau to approve the transfer of Pastor Bill and Jane Runaas to Immanuel Lutheran Church in Washington, Iowa. Shelton seconded. Motion carried.
