Pastor Writes



It never occurred to me that one of my sons might be a Jehovah's Witness.

In the entire span of possibilities regarding the future of my three sons, I have entertained the following possible scenarios: academia, the fine arts, the culinary arts, authorship, the ministry, science, law enforcement/criminals...but never had it dawned on me that one might turn up as a JW.

Until I got a call from our elementary school on October 31, 2012. Apparently, my middle son had gone to the principal's office *voluntarily*. It seems one of his fellow students is a Jehovah's Witness and regularly goes to the office during class holiday parties, because her religion forbids her to participate. This has greatly disturbed my son on prior occasions. But this time, rather than simply watch her leave the room as the class Halloween party began, he decided to take her side. So he walked with her to the office, and calmly listened to the reasons why he should return to his classroom, since his religion didn't prevent such festivities. Still, he politely refused, preferring instead to sit with his classmate and color pictures.

That is when I received the phone call from the school, and when I asked to speak with my son, he explained, "Mom, if she has to sit here all alone, I think I need to sit here, too." He agreeably took an unexcused absence for the afternoon, with no protest or punishment on my part. His decision showed remarkable depth of character and empathy for those who are marginalized.

I can think of no better image than this to illustrate the kind of love that Jesus embodies. Jesus seeks out those who are on the fringes of society, the ones who always seem to find themselves on the outside, and sits down next to them, eats with them, listens to them, loves them. Think of the ones he sought out in the New Testament—the tax

collectors, the prostitutes, the demon-possessed, the diseased, the dead. My son's aligning himself with his classmate, even if it meant taking a demerit for it, was a brave move in showing the kind of love Jesus has for the outsider.

For whenever we draw a line between ourselves and an outsider, Jesus takes the side of the outsider.

If you are wanting to listen to a fascinating sermon on this, I commend to you a pastor by the name of Greg Boyd, who serves Woodland Hills Christian Church in St. Paul, Minnesota, Find him on YouTube, the video entitled "Gay Marriage Amendment." I realize by even naming the title, several of you might have suddenly put this article down...but I encourage you to give it a chance. Because in it, Pr. Boyd applies the New Testament ideas of judgment to issues such as—but not limited to—homosexuality. I am not asking you to be convinced one way or the other, because we all know the ELCA has room for our most conservative and our most liberal members, but I am simply asking you to give his sermon a chance. Like it, hate it—whatever. Just give it a listen. It's a half hour. You've listened to far worse stuff for a lot longer than that! (not my sermons, of course!) If you do not have access to a computer and would like to view Pr. Boyd's sermon, please contact me.

Pr. Boyd calls on Jesus' Sermon on the Mount (one of my all-time favorite sections of scripture) in order to hold us accountable for those times in life when we judge others, but also to strengthen us in those times when we find the fingers pointing at us. Because, as we all know, the judges always one day end up being judged themselves. One day we point our finger at someone; the next day we find them pointing their (Continued on following page)

finger right back at us. To what end? This is not Christianity. Jesus desires mercy, not judgment; if you are skeptical, read the book of Matthew.

I thought of my son sitting in the office, coloring next to his classmate, while the rest of his friends played Pin-The-Tail-On-The-Black-Cat and ate pumpkin cupcakes, and my heart swelled with pride, for he sat exactly where Jesus himself would have chosen to sit...this little boy had more courage to stand in quiet Christian solidarity with an outsider than most grownups I know, including myself.

An unlikely Christian witness, perhaps, with a missing front tooth, a cowlick and a Kool-Aid smile, but a heckuva one, indeed.
