Pastor's View

Dear Siblings in Christ,

In the adult education hour we have been discussing the topic of 'vocation.' If we have heard of the word 'vocation' before, we often confine to our professional careers and/or what we do at church. However, Martin Luther defined vocation as "a station which is by nature helpful to others." All of us occupy many stations in our lives! Some of mine are friend, pastor, spouse, citizen, child, and sibling. I invite you to come up with some of your own stations, and to realize that these are all also your vocations! Where do all these vocations come from? They come to us as gifts in our baptisms. When a person is baptized, one of the fruits of their baptism is their vocations, which are summarized in our baptismal liturgy...

"so that they may learn to trust God, proclaim Christ through word and deed, to care for others and the world God made, and to work for justice and peace." (ELW pg. 228)

Everything that we do, every moment of the day is significant to the kingdom of God because God has promised us it will be so in our baptisms!

Our vocations are the unique ways each of us live out our response to God's love for us, which came to us first, in Jesus Christ through the Holy Spirit. Furthermore, our vocations are not things we have to do alone! We are meant to encourage and support each other in our vocations. So I invite you to consider your own vocations and consider where you might need support or encouragement. I also invite you to notice the gifts and talents of others and to encourage the people in your lives in their vocations. I believe this to be a part of how we build each other up as the Body of Christ and one of the ways we can connect more deeply to each other as a community.

There will be a meal at Faith following the 10:30 service. Beef, potatoes, and beverages will be provided. Please bring a side dish, salad, or dessert to share.

Feeding the Hungry . . .

1) Faith and Our Savior's are participating in a Thrivent event called **Take Away Hunger** on Tuesday, October 25. Time and location are to be determined. Sign-up sheets are at the back of each sanctuary for the 13 volunteers needed to form an assembly line to package one-pot rice and bean meals that are shipped nationwide for food banks and disaster relief. Calamus Lutheran Parish will contribute \$675 to cover the cost of 2,500 meals.

2) On Reformation Sunday, October 30, a special collection will be taken at both Our Savior's and Faith for the food pantry at the **Carroll Assistance Center in Wheatland.**

3) A Noisy Offering is collected by the children at worship on the third Sunday of each month. The 2022 recipient is **ELCA World Hunger**.

4) The 2022 Sunday School offering is designated for **ELCA World Hunger**.

5) The **Feeding the Children** program continues to provide weekend meals sent home on Fridays with eight Calamus-Wheatland students. A list of food items to donate is at the back of each church.
