Pastor Writes

The legend is that Martin Luther was the first one to bring the Christmas tree as we know it indoors. It is said Luther went out for a stroll in the woods in Germany on Christmas Eve, back in the 1500's. As he trudged through the hills, he was awestruck by the beauty of the night-time sky, all sparkling and brilliant with shining stars. And so, he was inspired to recreate this serene scene in his own home by cutting down an evergreen tree, dragging it into his living room and decorating it with candles, which sparkled and twinkled like the stars in the sky. To be sure, the Luther home rejoiced when the father triumphantly erected the snowy tree in the home, and the six Luther children undoubtedly obediently and orderly took turns lighting the candles and commending their father on his brilliant idea. More than likely, his dutiful and flushed wife Katy brought Luther a mug of her famous homebrew and tenderly kissed him on the cheek, thanking him for thinking of his family in such a touching way. Assuredly, the domestic animals lay at his feet, as the Luther family sat down round the tree and began to sing Christmas carols, the only other sounds being the bleating of the sheep and the lowing of the cattle from their nearby barn.

This is an altogether lovely scene. Breathtaking. Calm and bright. Just like Christmas Eve's around our homes, right?

Right.

I've often smiled to myself when this legend presents itself, and I choose that evening to be one I would ask a genie wafting from a bottle, "Please let me be a fly on the wall of the Luther home on *that* Christmas Eve, way back in the early 1500's...I'd like to see how things *really* unfolded..."

Let's be realistic.

It had to have been crazy. And chaotic. Pandemonium? Maybe.

It is Christmas Eve. Not only is the Luther home buzzing with its own six children, but it also hosts some of Katy's relatives and at least half a dozen nieces and nephews from her side of the family. Not to mention the constant stream of students and academics that were perpetual guests at the Luther family home. All preparing for Christmas mass the next morning. Not to mention their dog, either chasing or being chased by any number of small children. Not to mention loud, boisterous music (for the Luther family was very musically inclined). Not to mention heated, arduous debate (by said students and academics, heightened by Katy's potent home brew). Whew!

Luther decides to take a break and go for a calm walk in the woods. Did Katy glare at him? Did she mumble German unpleasantries under her breath? Did she whisper something to him about sleeping on the couch that night? So he leaves the lively home for a serene stroll in the woods, and a short time later bursts through the door, announcing that they would now need to find a place for this tree...ordering Katy to go get candles, urging his children to push the furniture around to make room...leaving a path of melting snow and pine needles on the floor behind him...Katy rushes by, shooing the dog out of the way with a broom. perhaps taking a swing at Luther's backside as she flies by, perhaps taking a hearty swig of her own home brew as she goes...

What is this fresh mess my husband has now created, she thinks? What is this new chaos, just as things were starting to calm down? My home does not need any more disorder or upheaval... Why can't we leave the untidiness of Christmas outside?

And yet, isn't that exactly what Jesus wants at Christmas, and always? Doesn't he want to enter (Continued on following page)

our lives, not as we want our lives to be, but as they really are? Our bickering relatives and fighting children do not deter Jesus from the love he has for us. He has not entered into our staged and fake reality; he has entered into our genuine reality—where disease lives, and with it, sorrow and failure and disorder. Jesus understands the human heart is not a beautiful, serene, picture-perfect still life. Rather, it is a hot mess, yearning for God to join us in this struggle of life, to reach out his flesh hand to grasp our flesh hand as we walk through life.

Christmas is all about mess...the trail of melting snow and pine needles and a barking dog and a stocky German wife chasing her husband with a broom as their children look on amusedly...it's about the broken toy and the wrong batteries and the maxed out credit card and the downsized job and the failing student and the dying grandmother and the anxious soul and the pacing feet and the wringing hands and the secret tears. It's about a God who is undeterred by our mess; indeed, it's about a God who welcomes the chaos we create...it's nothing he hasn't battled before, and won.



At the November Council Meetings

Joint Council:

- ➤ Worship Committee: Services have been planned for Christ the King, Thanksgiving and Hanging of the Greens; guidelines for Altar Ministry, Ushers, Communion Assistants, Lectors and Cleaning committees were reviewed; during Adult Class on November 17 and 24 information will be shared concerning these service ministries;
- ➤ Stewardship and Christian Outreach Committee: a potluck, hayride and bonfire were held at Annette and Dirk Braets November 9;
- Education Committee: Teachers and students are adjusting to the limited space for classes and additional material has been ordered to accommodate the larger enrollment; Christmas program practice will be held during a portion of the Sunday School hour with program to be held on December 15 at Our Savior's; No Sunday School on December 22 and 29, classes resume on January 5, 2014; Busy Bags have been filled and will be sent to New Jersey church;
 - > Photo directory copies were ordered;
- ➤ Heather Grau volunteered to create and maintain a parish Facebook page she will present a sample page, answer questions about ownership and monitoring of content, and explain the procedure for photo publication permissions at the December 12 council meeting;
- > Subscription was renewed for the monthly Church Service Directory in *The Observer*.

Faith Council:

- ➤ Financial reports were approved with a designated balance of \$4,319.40 and a working balance of \$8,731.67
 - > Specific boiler repair costs were confirmed;
- ➤ Clarification will be made concerning the Study Bible accounting item;
- Permission was given to the Property and Management Committee to seek bids and begin replacement of two tanks, piping system, material and related labor costs for boiler repair;
- ➤ Braet has informed the service provider contact to cease automatic delivery and automatic billing for boiler chemicals as the current supply is sufficient for 2013—2014;
- ➤ Requests of transfer of membership to Faith Lutheran Church from Joshua, Tiesha, Alexa and Avery Jacobi was accepted;

- ➤ Children waiting for the morning school bus will not be allowed into the church due to past damage and inappropriate behavior within the church building the front doors will be locked;
- ➤ Permission was given to Brad Schroeder and Amber Lindaman of St. John Lutheran (Bliedorn) to have their wedding at Faith on December 7;
- ➤ Annual reports are due in December 2013 and financial reports are due in January 2014;
- > Explanation was given concerning the division and management of Confirmation and Luther League funds;
- ➤ A letter of interest was submitted regarding snow removal Braet will seek specific cost and service information and inform them of job expectations.

Our Savior's Council:

- Financial reports were approved with a balance of \$720.11
 - Wedding guidelines were finalized;
- > Dan has completed the building of the computer and it is now in use;
- > \$150 will be donated to the Angel Tree project emphasis will be put on making this a priority for Luther League to raise the money;
- > A reminder was given to submit annual reports on time.


