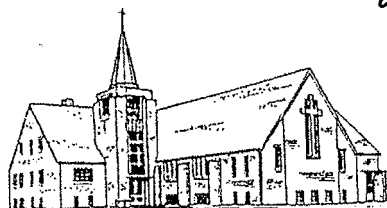

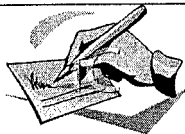

The season is Lent. We began the season on Ash Wednesday and we continue to observe this season for the next forty days (I know that if one were to count these days one would come up with forty-six days. But we count only the days during the week, not the Sundays that begin each week. We say that Lent consists of forty fasting days. Sundays are feast days. This is so because Sundays are always celebrations of Easter. Even though we may tone down our Easter celebration on a Sunday, it is still a feast day.). Thus we will observe Lent up until the celebration of Easter.

Lent is a word whose meaning has evolved over the centuries. Originally it had to do with spring (although this year it seems to have retained little connection with spring). Later it came to mean "fortieth" as in "forty days." It has been observed over the centuries as a time for Christians to prepare for the celebration of Easter. This preparation consists of prayer, penance, repentance, atonement, and self-control. It has been used over the centuries as a time to prepare new believers for baptism. Thus it is a time for the teaching of the faith. Lutherans have traditionally observed Lent precisely as a time to learn, relearn, and refocus on what it is that we believe. Thus, again, traditionally, this teaching has revolved around Luther's Small Catechism as the means by which we teach the faith.

Hopefully as believers, during Lent, we will take more time for prayer, more time for reading and meditating on the Holy Scriptures, more time listening to the speaking of the Holy Spirit. And, yes, more time for repentance. Repentance is a word that we really don't take to seriously today. We think of repentance as a listing of our sins.

Martin Luther himself thought of it in this way in his early years. He would spend hours, many hours, each week with his confessor, listing sin after sin after sin. He was in fear for his soul that an unconfessed sin would be an unforgiven sin. So, it is with some wonder that we discover when Luther wrote the Ninety-Five Theses in 1517 that later sparked the Reformation the very first of the Ninety-Five Theses was *When our Lord and Master Jesus Christ said, "Repent," (Matthew 4:17) he willed the entire life of believers to be one of repentance.* So, was Luther expecting us to spend hours in private confession listing each and every one of our sins? Not at all! Through his study of the Holy Scriptures Luther came to understand that repentance meant something entirely different. The Greek word *metanoia* was to be translated as "repent" and not as "do penance." And *metanoia* actually meant "to change one's mind." Thus, repentance becomes an opportunity to examine one's own life in the light of God's Word and will. Repentance becomes an opportunity for a Spirit-guided change in one's life. Repentance is a change in direction of one's life. It is as if one is walking away from God and turns and changes direction so that one walks toward God. Now, that becomes exactly our daily life. It is a life of daily turning away from walking away from God in our sin to walking daily toward God, to facing God. That is what we do every day. That becomes our life. It is the work of the Holy Spirit within us. This is Holy Spirit work. Daily the Holy Spirit enables us to repent. Daily the Holy Spirit turns us away from our sin. Daily the Holy Spirit turns us and our life toward God. Thus, we live lives of daily repentance.

So, in a real sense what we are called to do during Lent becomes the life that we live day in and day out 365 days a year. The life of repentance becomes a joyous life, the Easter life.

- Worship Committee has met and reviewed upcoming services.
- Stewardship and Christian Outreach Committee has sent tentative dates for events in 2015.
- Call Committee will interview another candidate on February 28.
- Cost-saving measures for shared expenditures will be reviewed.
- Discussion was held on the parish's purchasing cell phone and plan.
- At the March 8 CALCO breakfast, Faith has the early shift from 7:30—10:00 a.m. and Our Savior's the late shift from 10:00 –12:30.

Faith Council:

- Approved financial reports with a designated balance of \$528.22 and checkbook balance of \$28,791.99.
- Parishoners continue to perform snow removal until someone is hired.
- Congregation committees assignments are finalized with Mark seeking 2 move individuals to complete the nominating committee.
- There is a plan to proceed with the plastering of the bell tower area, hallway and classrooms affected by the water leaks.
- Water running in the secretary's office windows has been solved with gutter being salted and electric heat grid applied.
- Ceiling fan in front of church is not working – will follow up with the original installers to determine appropriate method of repair/replacement.
- Review of topics brought up in Joint Council including what expenditures are shared by the churches and if there are any areas in which cost cutting measures could be addressed jointly vs. individually.
- Call Committee Update: have had 2 candidates – one is coming later this month for an interview.

Our Savior's Council:

- Financial reports were approved with a balance of \$1,429.15.
- Still looking for a replacement for Yale

Christensen for lawn care.

- Officers were elected: President – Dan Burke; Vice President – Brian Boussetot; Treasurer – Jason Boussetot; Secretary – Megan Will;
- There will be an increase in property insurance.

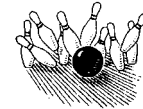

- ▶ On January 25, 2015, President Mark Witte called the Faith Annual Meeting to order with 21 members present.
- ▶ Pastor Aanonson led devotions.
- ▶ 2014 Annual Meeting minutes were read.
- ▶ Pastor's report, congregation and committee reports were reviewed and approved.
- ▶ Financial Secretary's report, Treasurer's report and Audit Committee's reports were presented and approved.
- ▶ The 2015 Proposed Budget was presented by Brian Tulley.
- ▶ No major property projects are anticipated for 2015 and the pastoral package is part of the call process.
- ▶ The 2014 Proposed Budget was approved.
- ▶ The call process has begun with one interview being held today.
- ▶ Terri Boussetot and Keith Gasper completed their council terms. Ashley Steffens and Marilyn Schau were placed in nomination for first 3-year terms; Dirk Braet was nominated for a second 3-year term. All nominees were elected.
- ▶ Terri Boussetot and Keith Gasper will serve as the 2015 Nominating Committee; two additional members will be added.

Our Savior's Congregation Annual Meeting Notes



- ▶ The meeting was called to order on January 25, 2015 at 9:09 by President Dan Burke.
- ▶ Devotions were from Romans 2.
- ▶ Minutes of 2014 meeting were read and accepted.
- ▶ Reports were read on own time.
- ▶ The 2014 Proposed Budget was reviewed.
- ▶ Approval was given that the Carrie Olson Estate money be set so the principle amount not be used unless there is an emergency and then only by congregational vote and the interest earned off the principle be used for general expenses, if needed. The principle has already been invested in an Edward Jones account with the amounts listed in the financial report.
- ▶ The 2014 committee reports were accepted.
- ▶ The 2015 Proposed Budget was discussed with mention of the pastor's salary being unknown until a pastor is called but only slight changes anticipated; question was raised to the need of a full-time pastor; substitute pastor pay is not high due to council presidents leading worship.
- ▶ Expenses are exceeding giving and more discussion needs to be done to work this out.
- ▶ The 2015 Proposed Budget was approved.
- ▶ Joe Morehead was nominated to serve on council and was elected. He will replace Shane Glover whose term has expired.
- ▶ Shane Glover will serve on 2015 Nominating Committee.
- ▶ Joe Morehead and Pastor Aanonson will serve as delegates to the 2015 Southeastern Iowa Synod Assembly at Lutheran Church of Hope, Des Moines, May 29—30.
- ▶ Dan Burke reported the Call Committee has 2 names for review.
- ▶ Meeting adjourned at 9:47 a.m.
