Wellness at Worship

The following changes to worship may alleviate some of your concerns about gathering safely for worship while not affecting our time together.

- Greeters will no longer shake hands or give hugs, but give you a verbal greeting.
- When we offer a sign of peace, we will do so without touching each other. You may smile, share a word of peace, nod your head or bow, or use sign language. It is not necessary you leave your pew.
- Offering plates will not be passed but are placed where you can place your offering before or after worship.
- All those involved in distributing communion will use hand sanitizer.
- As we leave church, Pastor will stand in the back as usual, but will not shake your hand or hug you.

If you do not feel well during worship service, please signal an usher for assistance. Items which may offset low blood sugar are stored in the refrigerator in the kitchen. Please contact Pastor or a Council Member if you have any questions or concerns.

And most important, if you do not feel well, please stay home.

Facemasks for Healthcare Workers

Our parish can assist in the sewing of health masks for healthcare workers. These masks are washable and reusable. Please open this link to view pattern instructions.

Diane Wilhelm has revised the pattern in the following ways.

- Insert a pipe cleaner across top edge and stitch along right below it to keep it in place, before stitching up the sides.
- Change the length of the elastic to 7" long, instead of 6 1/2". The elastic seemed too tight around my ears, and would pull too much after having them on for any length of time.
- Make some with elastic of 7 1/2". This may be an appropriate size for men.

You may deliver the masks to Faith Church. Diane will sort and organize them into 1 gallon plastic food storage bags. She will also deliver to locations which use them.

Thank you for using your sewing skills to improve the safety of healthcare workers. Their working environment can be a risk to their personal safety and that of their families.

If one cannot sew, then pray for all those providing care and needing care.


