Pastor's View

I hereby command you: Be strong and courageous; do not be frightened or dismayed, for the Lord your God is with you wherever you go. (Joshua 1:9)

When I was talking to one of our members, she reminded me of this verse. I want to share it with all of you. Emotional Exhaustion

As I visit with people, I can hear in their voices the toll this pandemic is taking on their emotional well-being. I have been thinking about this for many weeks, trying to think of ways to minister to people when we find ourselves isolated. Isolation comes in many forms. Isolation does not just affect those who are shut-ins. People of all ages are feeling the effects of not being able to do what they took for granted before COVID. We miss our friends and family.

This week, I received word from Montana that one of my former confirmation students died by suicide. This 15-year-old young man tragically decided on a permanent solution to a temporary problem. I don't know all the circumstances that led to his decision, but my heart breaks for his family and friends who will now live with doubts and what-if's that come from the guilt of not being able to help him.

I tell you this story because I want you to be aware of those around you who may be struggling. Do not take anything for granted. Do not assume they will get better on their own. Look for signs that someone may be emotionally exhausted – anxiety, depression, irritability, fatigue, nervousness, tearfulness, etc. Talk to them, be proactive, ask the person if they are considering suicide. It may be the most important question you ever asked someone. If you find this too difficult, let me know, I will be glad to help you.

I have the suicide hotline number as a contact in my phone. It is a number you can pass on to someone or it is a number you can use if you need help. The number is 1-800-273-8255. Put it in your phone and use it if you need it. We are in this together and we will get through it. Let's all find ways to support each other.

 - Calamus Lutheran Parish will receive a \$500 match because \$675 was raised for the "Feeding the Children" program which provides food to a number of Cal-Wheat students on the weekends.
- ➤ "Feeding the Children" expenses were \$184 for the month. The number of students served will go from 7 to 15 in 2021.
- ➤ Mid-week Advent services will not be held on Wednesdays.
