Pastor's View

The Israelites became impatient on the way. The people spoke out against God and against Moses, "Why have your brought us up out of Egypt to die in the wilderness? For there is no food and no water, and we detest the food." (Numbers 21:4b-5)

These words were spoken after Moses freed the people from the Egyptians, but before they had reached the promised land. They were in what we would call a liminal state. Liminality is the time between an ending and a new beginning. A modern day example of liminality is an airport. When you are in the airport, you are in the in-between time. You have left your home, but have not yet arrived at your destination.

Our Savior's and Faith churches are in a liminal time. The time between the retirement of their pastor and the new pastor arriving. Susan Beaumont in her book, "How to Lead When You Don't Know Where You Are Going," says that "in organizational settings predictable behaviors emerge in the neutral space: anxiety rises; motivation falls; attendance drops off; old weaknesses reemerge; old conflict issues reemerge; personnel are overloaded; people in the organization are easily polarized between those who want to rush forward into the new thing and those who long to return to the old familiar ways."

As your interim pastor, I want to invite you to take this liminal time to step back and think about what you see as the future ministry in these congregations. What are your hopes and dreams for the years to come? This is an ideal time to get a clear idea of your identity as a church and as a parish. There is no reason to be anxious about the future. God is in charge and is here guiding you.

When I worked in the Southeastern Iowa Synod office, I interacted with many pastors who were waiting for a new call. They, too, became anxious when their wait became longer than they had hoped. My advice to them was to be patient. Each pastor has a call waiting for them and each congregation has a pastor that will be well-matched for their needs, it is knowing how to live in that liminal time until God brings the match together. I had pastors come to me after they received a call and tell me that it was worth the wait and they thanked me for my words of encouragement.

In our liminal time, I invite you to be an active voice as the councils look at how to move forward and how to plan for future ministry in Calamus, in the Southeastern Iowa Synod and in the world. If you have not been to worship for a while, I hope you will come and join us. I'd love to get to know you and we would welcome your thoughts and ideas. If you are unable to join us, call me and I would be glad to come and visit you. We are the church together.

Pastor's Report:

Pastor read an excerpt from "How to Lead When You Don't Know Where You are Going" by Susan Beaumont.

The main point was to think about what we can do to move forward as a parish while we wait for a full-time pastor. What can we improve?

Worship Committee:

All Holy Week worship services were reviewed.

- Palm Sunday 8:00 a.m. at Our Savior's 10:30 a.m. at Faith
- Maundy Thursday 6:30 p.m. at Our Savior's
- Good Friday 6:30 p.m. at Faith
- Easter 7:00 a.m. at Our Savior's 9:30 a.m. at Faith No Sunday School will be held Easter Sunday.

Setting 3 in ELW will be used beginning Easter Sunday. Hymnals may be used.

Each congregation will determine their own bulletin format and content.

Feeding the Children:

Hurt purchased \$34 in supplies and will submit a credit card statement to Henning for payment due to lost receipt.

Education Committee:

Bible School will be held on the first four Mondays in May immediately after school from 3:15-5:00 at Faith for children in kindergarten through fifth grade.

- Registration forms will be due April 12.
- Masks will be required.
- Children will remain in rooms and teachers will rotate.
- Cash donations will be sought for packaged snacks and bottled water.

Old Business:

Effectiveness of the Emergency Notification Text System was discussed.

- Federal time frame restrictions require the message be sent after 8:00 a.m. and prior to 9:00 p.m. It is important decisions be made one day ahead in order to be effective.
- Parish members will again be asked for current cell phone numbers and emails.
- The parish text number is 940-310-8531.
 All members should put this number in their Contacts.
- In the future, Burke will send texts and Hurt will send emails.

Each congregation will adapt their own safety protocol for worship services.

New Business:

Motion made by Bousselot to send Noisy Offering funds to Carroll Assistance Center in Wheatland. Burke seconded. Motion carried.

The summer worship schedule was discussed.

- One proposal was to hold one joint service during several/alternating summer months beginning at 9:00 a.m. Councils will discuss individually.
- Item was tabled and will be added to April Joint Council Agenda.
