Pastor's View

Dear Siblings in Christ,

At the time of writing this, I have just come back from synod assembly and would like to share about this. Mark and Marsha Witte attended as Faith delegates, and their reflections can be found within this newsletter.

If you are unfamiliar with what synod assembly is, a good comparison is that it is similar to our annual meetings in January. Rostered (pastors and deacons) and lay people from the congregations around the Southeastern Iowa Synod gather to do the work of the synod, and this year's theme was "Listen! God is Calling." We passed a synod budget, heard reports from the Office of the Bishop, elected lay and rostered representatives to synod councils and committees, and this year we elected lay and rostered representatives for the Churchwide assembly in 2025. We also worshiped together and attended two educational sessions.

As I reflect on synod assembly this year, I am reminded once again that relationships matter. God is always calling us to trust in the new things that God is doing, and those new things happen because of deep and authentic relationships. We see this throughout the Bible: God did a new thing by bringing the Israelites to Egypt, which was made possible by Joseph's relationship to Pharaoh; God did a new thing by being born as Jesus, made possible by the relationship of Mary and Joseph; and God did a new thing by Jesus dying and rising for us, because God desires that much to be in relationship with you and all people.

As we as members of Calamus Lutheran Parish listen for the ways that God is calling us to love and serve this world, I remember that the relationships we have because of Jesus with each other and with our community is the central thing. As Paul writes in 1 Corinthians, if we do anything, but do it without the love of Christ, we are better off to have never done it in the first place. Our God is a God of relationships, who is always calling us into deeper relationships with Jesus, with each other, and with the world. I hope and pray that I listen for this calling well. I hope and pray that as a parish we listen for this calling well. Trusting that God is with us, will never abandon us, and is always reaching out to us with the promises of Jesus.

Old Business

Reflections on the 2024 Southeastern Iowa Synod Assembly from Mark and Marsha Witte.

Thank you for the opportunity to serve as Faith's delegates.

LISTEN! God is Calling God is about to do a new thing. Do you not perceive it? (Isaiah 43:19)

It was the first synod assembly in person since 2019. The last four assemblies have been via Zoom.

There was not much time for chit-chat, but we enjoyed sitting with Pastor Leah, Pastor Stephen, and Leslie. Assembly was an opportunity to see Pastors with Calamus connections: Roberta, Sarah, Brian, Dennis, and Dianne. We also saw Bishop Haugen and his wife Diane. It was exciting for us to meet former Calamus Lutheran Parish Sunday School "kids:" Jen Shoemaker Pote (a delegate from Palestine, Huxley) and Dennis Rodenberg (the pastor of St. John, Olin and Zion, Wyoming).

Because of advances in technology, there were no printed materials. The prayers and music were projected on a big screen. We used electronic devices for the agenda, biographies, and a QR code for voting and donating. Otherwise, it was business as usual with presentations, elections, approving the budget, and receiving salary guidelines. You can find everything online by searching Southeastern Iowa Synod Assembly.

Four resolutions were passed concerning:

- 1) 50th Anniversary of ELCA World Hunger
- 2) Welcoming refugees, immigrants, and asylum seekers
- 3) Peace in the Holy Land
- 4) Gun Violence

All four resolutions have actions expected:

- 1) Consider special gifts of \$50 during August.
- 2) Study the plight of those seeking to enter the United States and how to help them.
- 3) Make October 6 a day of remembrance and learning about the conflict in Palestine and Israel.
- 4) Set aside January 4, 2025 as a day for education, remembrance, and prayer.

There are materials available from the synod and churchwide with information on ELCA polices and ways to be involved. There are organizations actively engaged in making a difference. Ammparo is the ELCA strategy for protecting migrants. Sumud is working for justice in Palestine and Israel. Find the links at www.elca.org

The synod has prepared a three-session Bible study for congregations to use in September titled "Listen! God is Calling."

An excellent jazz ensemble provided music throughout the meetings and the lead trumpeter composed the liturgy for worship. He taught the assembly songs in several languages and encouraged congregations to use music to teach about different cultures.

"Shrink-Smart Small Towns" was a presentation by two Iowa State professors researching how communities and churches can still thrive as they lose population. It is important to not focus on the past or worry about the future. Appreciate what you have, acknowledge the gifts of leaders, and work together. Control what you can control to make the quality of life the best it can be for those in your town and your congregation.

Our major take-away was that the ELCA is in good hands. There are people with bright minds and amazing skill sets taking the church into the future, who are not afraid of change.

The 2025 assembly will be a one-day event on May 17 at Grandview College in Des Moines.
