Pastor's View

Dear Siblings in Christ,

As we know, Advent began our new church year, and it also means our Gospel readings are now coming to us from the Gospel according to Luke. We, like most mainline Protestant churches in this country, follow a three-year lectionary cycle for all of our readings. Each year focuses on a particular gospel book from Matthew, Mark, or Luke. John gets mixed in here and there throughout the years (and especially in Mark's year because it is the shortest!). While each of the four gospels tells the story of God's love for us and the whole world in Jesus's life, death, and resurrection, each of them has their own unique bend on the story.

Luke's gospel is where we find particular attention is paid to the voices of women and the sick, and out of all four gospels, it places the most emphasis on salvation in Jesus being for Jews and Gentiles (non-Jewish people) alike. Mary sings her Magnificat, the demon-possessed and sick engage in conversation with Jesus, and the parable of the Good Samaritan shows that God's love can come to us through people who we assume are enemies. In Luke we see how God's love is always reaching for the most unexpected people in the most unexpected places, and it is unexpected people often in unexpected places who will bring us the promises of God in Jesus.

As we journey through Luke this year, I invite you to pay attention to the unexpected places that God shows up in our gospel readings, and I invite you to pay attention to the unexpected places that God is and will be showing up in your life and in the life of our community. We trust that God is speaking to us still, that Jesus is always redeeming, and the Holy Spirit is always stirring up hearts and minds. May we notice it and may we be willing to join in.
