So, what are we doing here? In the church building? At worship? Why do we gather together every Sunday? Is it out of habit? I am sure that habit has much to do with it, and that is not all so bad. Some habits are good habits. But it goes beyond habit. It goes to who we are as followers of Jesus Christ. Martin Luther helps us to answer the question in his explanation to the Third Commandment. In his Small Catechism Luther repeats the Third Commandment, Remember the Sabbath day to keep it holy. He then asks his usual question, What does this mean? He answers, We should fear and love God, and so we should not despise His Word and the preaching of the same, but deem it holy and gladly hear and learn it. We often think and have been taught that the reason for this commandment is that we take a day of rest from our normal work even as God took a day of rest from the work of the creation. The Hebrew people to whom this commandment was given understood that by taking a day of rest they were testifying to all the other peoples around them that they worshiped Yahweh, the God who created all that exists. This was their witness. Luther, in his explanation to the Third Commandment, takes this understanding a step further. He says that we take a day off from our normal activities so that we could receive God's gifts. We become so wrapped up in all the work and activities of daily life that we always, to one extent or another, forget the good news that God has to proclaim to us. God knows that we need to hear and receive His gifts to us. He tells us and reminds us that we are His loved, forgiven, and accepted children of God. He reminds us of our baptismal identity as the "died for." He reminds us of the promises that He has given to us that we are always His and live daily in His grace. His gifts to us include not just the spoken and written Word, but

the Word that comes to us through the Holy Sacraments: Holy Baptism and the Lord's Supper. The Word and the Sacraments are His gifts to us. We need them daily. We need to come together and receive these gifts. This is reason enough to come together. We are called together to receive His gifts, gifts without which we die.

But there is more. Even as the early Hebrews, we gather together to witness to the community in which we live. We gather together for the sake of our neighbor. Worship and our call to worship is more than just for our sake. It is so easy to begin to think and believe that the community in which we gather for the worship of God is focused on us, on our friendships, on being together. The truth of the matter is that our worship is not just for us to receive God's gifts, but for the sake of our neighbor. We gather together to be sent out. Jesus words in Matthew 28:18-20 remind us of who we are and the task to which we have been called. All authority in heaven and on earth has been given to Me. Go therefore and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit, teaching them to observe all that I have commanded them. And behold, I am with you always to the end of the age. We worship together to be sent out to proclaim the good news to our neighbor, to make them into disciples of Jesus, even as we are disciples of Jesus through our Holy Baptism, to baptize them, and to teach them all that our Lord has taught us. We, in the Church, are not a memorial society gathered to remember Jesus. We are not a neighborhood coffee klatch enjoying each other's fellowship. We are disciples of Jesus who are to tell our neighbors the good news and to invite our neighbors to come and hear the word of (Continued on following page)

God and to receive the Holy Sacraments. If we are not doing that, we must ask if we are a church. If we are not reaching out to our neighbors, then why are we gathered together each Sunday morning? If nothing else, the gifts of God that we receive impel us to reach out to our neighbor. That neighbor might be just across the road, across the section, a few miles or several miles down the road. That neighbor might be a member of our own family. If, when we leave worship, we do not have a concern for our neighbor, we missed something in worship.

We are called together every Sunday morning to receive God's wonderful gifts of His love, forgiveness, and acceptance communicated to us through His Word and through the Holy Sacraments. Because we have received those gifts we leave worship with a renewed concern for our neighbor that we go, make disciples, baptize, and teach those very neighbors. To accomplish that we give our very being and all that we have, our time, talents, and treasure, even as our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ has given His all for us.

Congregations Approve Extending a Pastoral Call

Our Savior's Church and Faith Church each held their individual specially-called congregational meeting to have their voting members decide whether to call Pastor Bill Runaas of Sumner, Iowa to serve as their pastor. Our Savior's congregation approved with a 23—8 vote and Faith congregation approved with a 53—3 vote.

The congregation councils and call committee will now extend a Letter of Call to Pastor Runaas to serve as pastor of the Calamus Lutheran Parish.

At the June Council Meetings

Joint Council:

- ➤ Pastor Aanonson announced he will be gone July 5—12; Dan Burke and Mark Witte will lead worship in their respective congregations.
- ➤ Worship Committee stated Vicar Paul from St. John/Bliedorn will be leading worship for the Calamus Fun Days.
- ➤ Education Committee reported a good turnout for Vacation Bible School: 60 children, 22 visitors and 38 members (28 of those children attended Sunday School on a regular basis); a family field trip is being planned for late summer or early fall.
- ➤ A "Meet and Greet" with Pastor Runaas has been changed from Our Savior's to Faith Church due to handicap accessibility concerns; council members will provide refreshments.
- Approved congregational vote on calling Pastor Runaas to be held on June 21 following each congregation's worship service. Approval requires 2/3 of the votes and 15 voting members must be present.
- ➤ Karen Porth has assisted accompanying the choir on 2 separate practice sessions. It was approved to pay her at the traditional rate that has been used in the past and split the fee between the two churches.

Faith Council:

- Approved financial reports with a designated balance of \$37.73 and a working balance of \$36,664.68.
- Eric and Dirk continue to look into the boiler leak and will not proceed past the first T at this point without further assistance; Lindy's Flooring has been contacted for an estimate if flooring would have to be redone following repairs;
 - > A ceiling fan has been ordered.
- ➤ Pastor Aanonson suggested we may want to paint and update the pastor's office for when we would have a new pastor.
- > The situation of the air conditioner not working in Jeannene's office is being addressed.

- Approved having the congregational meeting on June 21.

Southeastern Iowa Synod Evangelical Lutheran Church in America

God's work. Our hands.

The 28th Assembly of the Southeastern Iowa Synod was held May 29 – May 30, 2015, at Lutheran Church of Hope in West Des Moines, Iowa. Over 450 voting members and guests gathered around the theme "In the Name of Jesus."

Pastor Wyvetta Bullock served as the churchwide representative providing updates and stories of the work we do together as the ELCA and delivered a sermon during worship on Saturday Morning, May 30th.

The primary business of this year's assembly was election of synod council members and churchwide voting members as well as several resolutions.

Bishop Michael Burk presided over the assembly, including the Friday evening service of Holy Communion. In his report, Bishop Burk provided highlights of our shared ministry since we last gathered in assembly, providing his assessment of the ways we called to live and serve "In the Name of Jesus."

Randy Willman was elected Synod Council Secretary

Adam Sacia, Pr. Mark Urluab, Deanne Bennett, Pr. Josh Martyn, Janice McElvain, Pr. Erika Uthe were elected to positions on the synod council.

Loteguluaki Langai, Noah Niermann, Jose Rodriguez, Isaac Stich, Awoke Dilusso, Hunter Collins, Pr. Pat Fish, Pr. Tim Smith, Pr. Kristine Dohrmann, Pr. Minna Quint, Pr. Paul Finger, Pr. Kathy Roys, Pr. Gemechisa Mosa, Marta Bauer, Deanne Bennett, Jodi Schumann, Alysse Trenkamp were elected as voting members to the 2016 churchwide assembly in New Orleans, LA.

Special guests, Pastor Paul Oman and the Heartland Youth Choir encouraged participants to use their unique gifts for ministry. Pastor Oman, did two live paintings during plenary sessions and worship.

Resolutions adopted included: 1) Peace Not Walls: a resolution encouraging those in the Southeastern Iowa Synod to learn, pray, and act around issues of the Israeli-Palestinian conflict; 2) Life of Faith initiative which encourages the priesthood of all believers, and life on ministry within churches; 3) Southeastern Iowa synod will support the Always Being Made New Campaign for the ELCA and will undertake a synod campaign; 4) A resolution of thanksgiving for the assembly and various ministries of the Southeastern Iowa Synod. Other business included the approval of the 2016 synod budget and minimum compensation guidelines. Congregations and rostered leaders celebrating anniversaries were celebrated and voting members took advantage of the many forums and organizational displays that were offered during assembly. The synod assembly offering was designated to synod hunger ministries - \$3,019.37 was given by congregations and individuals.

The 2016 Assembly of the Southeastern Iowa Synod will be held May 6-7 2016, at Marriott Hotel and Conference Center in Coralville, Iowa.
