At the September **Council Meetings**

Joint Council:

- Pastor Bill reported confirmation class has begun; he has completed his first round of shut-in visits and has begun other visits; he continues to work at unpacking.
- > Worship Committee met and discussed parts of the liturgy, upcoming worship services and the request by parents to have one acolyte per service.
- > Stewardship and Christian Outreach Committee have planned an outing at Doug Bousselot's pond.
- > Education Committee met and prepared for the beginning of Sunday School classes.
- > Significant discussion was held regarding First Communion. A consensus was reached that classes should be offered prior to First Communion. An age/grade to begin classes or Communion is still being discussed along with whether parents can choose to have their children commune earlier.

Faith Council:

- > Financial reports were approved with a designated balance of \$298.24 and a working balance of \$47,640.36.
- > Options are being looked into regarding the replacement of a portion of the pipe for the boiler.
- > Parsonage progress: landscaping with rock around the gutter endings at parsonage will be done to help with water going back in to the house; will look into an attic fan to help control internal temperature; window coverings will be purchased.
- > For Pastor's office a side table and office chair will be purchased and the desk will be upgraded.
- > Thanks was given to the Henning's for painting parking lot stripes.
- > \$54,000 allowance was noted on the insurance claim for hail damage.

Our Savior's Council:

- > Financial reports were approved with a balance of \$2,632.47.
- > Bids are still coming in for the siding on the parsonage.


