Pastor's View

Easter - We enter March already on our walk of faith towards Maundy Thursday, Good Friday and then Easter Celebration. Our Wednesdays in lent are a learning lesson in faith through the understanding of the theme of Water and the Witness. We end this journey faith with a Maundy Thursday service of scripture, washing of hands, Communion and then leaving in silence. This silence is a way to prepare for the worship of Good Friday. On Friday we will hear the message that it is our sinfulness that has put Christ on the Cross. It also shows us God's grace so we have the gift of relationship with God. We then move to Easter Celebration. We start Easter where Good Friday left us; at a tomb with no hope. But we soon worship with "He is Risen!" "He is Risen Indeed!" We also will see the best April Fools Day joke on Satan – Resurrection! I hope to see you in this Lenten/Easter journey.

Future Ministry Options for Calamus Parish

- 1. Multi-point Parish Continue to add points to the parish structure. Take our two point parish and add more congregations. Has a low expectation pay off that may have a declining future.
- 2. Teaching and Learning Options.
 - a. <u>Internship Site</u>. This is what Bliedorn Congregation is doing now. Congregation applies for Intern at the Synod level and at the Seminary. Intern would serve for one year. This is the 3rd year of the Seminarians 4 year program. Would commute from Dubuque. Cost is housing; & \$30-40,000 for the year. Challenge is having nearby Pastoral supervisor, Congregational committee to provide feedback.
 - b. Collaborative Learning Program Calamus Parish supports an "MDiv Collaborative Learning Program" with a person who wants to become a pastor in the ELCA. This person (from our congregation or another congregation) will serve as a "student-pastor" during the four years of academic online studies. The advantages for the "student-pastor" are: reduced student loans, real-time classroom participation, two campus workshops per year, and site congregational leadership. Calamus Parish becomes a teaching congregation; similar to an intern site. Candidates for the Collaborative Learning Program are nominated by their synods and approved by the ELCA. The student would spend all 4 years at the congregational site. This is a ½ time student at Seminary and ½ pastor in congregation at about 50 hours per week. Cost is about ½ time pastor

- salary plus benefits and housing. The Challenge is the need for a mentoring pastor and a supervising pastor. The student generally would not receive a call to hosting congregation. This may fall under the same rules as TEEM candidate. (See below.) Challenge would be to find a person who will commit to this call. Contact and work with Synod and seminary to work out all the details.
- c. Calamus Parish uses the "Theological Education for Emerging Ministries" (TEEM) style. The TEEM program provides preparation for those who will provide pastoral ministry in emerging ministry contexts including inner city, multicultural, **rural**, and other communities. Candidates for the TEEM program are supported by their community and will complete a three-year program with Wartburg Seminary. Candidates for the TEEM program are nominated by their synods and approved by the ELCA. Normally TEEM candidates are age 40 or older. TEEM is a focused ministry that works with the needs of a special congregations. Rural small congregations fulfill the definition of a TEEM qualified site. The candidate will study ½ time and work ½ time. After completing all studies the candidate is ordained into the ministry of that congregation. (Student remains in congregation.)
- d. Geographical Parish This is not a multi-point parish. (See 1. Above) This is a multi-point congregation that would mimic a large congregation. There would be a staff situation supporting many congregations. The goal would be to work under a unified mission; a unified Council and a unified program. The staff would reflect the needs of the geographic parish. There might be pastor(s), Deacon(s), Church Administrator, youth worker, musician, education director. Challenge would be the amount of change that would be required. Change causes greater risk. But a chance for greater growth in the ministry of the parish. One challenge is the amount of time needed to form a new parish with everyone willing to change, share and drive to where the ministry would be taking place. Challenge would be the fact that each congregation would not have church every Sunday in their building. Challenge would be
- e. the amount of trust that is needed to grow this into a Dynamic Model of a church.
- f. The last choice is that Calamus Parish does nothing. Calamus Parish would be hoping that the pastor does not retire or that the Synod provides a pastor right when the parish needs a pastor. The Synod does wonderful things, but that might be a little like a miracle in the making.

The point of this long explanation is that joint council is bringing these choices to the congregation on March 4, 2018. When the congregation makes a decision to go ahead with this method of "calling" a pastor then the PCC committee along with the joint council will take the next step in reaching the goal of having pastoral leadership for Calamus Parish in the coming years. The council and I will work with the Synod during this process. Please pray about our future. Please pray about our ministry. We have a lot to pray about, think about, and work towards a goal that will carry our congregations forward into the coming years. Thank You for looking at this option.
